WPOA Board of Trustees Saturday Meeting – 3/9/2024

- **Any updates from the Friday email are indicated in **italics** of the summary of each report.
- **The deadline for submission of information for the monthly newsletter and other media releases is the Tuesday following the WPOA meeting at 4pm.
 The Office staff appreciates the cooperation of all of the clubs to share the events and activities held at Lake Waynoka.

President Ellis called the meeting to order at 10:02 am.

President Ellis led the attendees in the Lord's Prayer followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call: Present: Barton, Bynum, Crank, Eads, Ellis, Moore, Taylor, Mgr. Cahall

Absent: Marck, & Raleigh. Both were excused.

Minutes: Barton made a motion and Taylor seconded to approve the 2/10/24 WPOA Monthly minutes as printed in the newsletter. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

President's Report (Ellis): President Ellis introduced Sue Levermore to speak about the annual WPOA dinner. Registration is required and must be submitted to the office by April 14th at noon. Doors open at 5:30 and dinner will be served at 6:00pm. Please bring your own drinks. The WRWSD meeting will begin promptly at 7:00pm. The WPOA meeting will begin at 7:30pm.

Treasurer's Report (Barton):

Operating funds

- February total operating income was \$348,000.
- February total operating expenses were \$222,000.00 with no unexpected expenses.
- Operating fund balance at the end of February was \$573,386.18.
- Operating income for the year at the end of February was \$504,000.00. That is 17% of the plan for 2024. Expected income at the end of February was 17% so right on budget.
- Operating expense for the year at the end of February was \$426,000.00. That is 14% of the plan for 2024. Expected expense at the end of February was 14% so right on budget.

Allocated Assessment Funds

- Income for allocated operating assessments in February was \$243,000.00.
- Assessment account expenditures in February totaled \$110,000.00 for marina dock project and dock repair.
- Balance of all allocated assessment accounts at the end of February was \$1,108,772.95.

Invested Funds

• Invested Reserves at the end of February totaled \$525,742.75.

Total cash on hand at the end of February was \$2,202,901.88.

Manager's Report (Paul Cahall):

- The new playground is going in back at the campground and will be ready for use when the campground reopens on April 1st. Maintenance and the campground manager are working hard to make sure everything is ready for the return of our campers.
- We have managed to save and reinforce more than half of the Pontiac docks. Maintenance still needs to remove the docks at the end of Pontiac that could not be repaired. The Board is looking at many different configurations and options for the future of Pontiac to make it more useful to our members.
- Lake Royal from North Carolina has requested to come for a visit to see our operation. They were doing research of other lakes and were impressed enough by our association to invest in a visit. Their lake is of similar size 4,000 lots, 350-acre lake. They will be visiting April 4th and 5th bringing 10 people made up of members, board members, and staff. If you see them, please make them feel welcome.
- The spring OLCA meeting will be held at Cinnamon Lake on May 8th and 9th. These are great opportunities for lake managers and board members to get together and share information and ideas on shared issues to make all member lakes better.
- We are working on the finishing touches at the Marina for the docking upgrades. We still need to put in bumpers to help protect boats and have the fueling station reinstalled. These final items should be complete by early next month.
- Maintenance rented a stump grinder attachment for our newly acquired skid steer and ground out many old stumps around the lake and in the campground. We continue working projects getting ready for another fun filled season at the lake.
- Mgr. Cahall spoke about the Lake Royal visit previously mentioned and answered questions.

Treasurer Barton asked P. Levermore about the number of new homes. Pete responded that there were roughly 26 new home permits last year and around 140 new home permits submitted over the past four years.

Election Inspectors/Nominating (Margi Borgman/Nan McHugh/Dawn McNees, Nominating Chairperson): None Lake Advisory (T. Redick/Jim Marck): Reminder: Beginning April 1, 2025, the owner of any boat to be used on Lake Waynoka must present evidence of having successfully completed a state approved boater education course at the time of registration. Certified instructors will offer classroom training at the Lake Waynoka Lodge building on Saturday, March 16. Classroom courses are scheduled for 8 hours, and registration is requested. Boating education specific to Lake Waynoka is also discussed in these sessions. There is no cost for this class. You may register by calling the WPOA office. The class originally scheduled for April 20, 2024 has been cancelled due to lack of demand. Additional dates will be considered in the future as may be needed. As outlined in previous reports, several other options for completing a NASBLA-approved classroom course are available in Ohio. Project Updates: The Lake Advisory Committee continues to work with the Board of Trustees as they consider committee recommendations relating to watercraft being operated on Lake Waynoka. President Ellis reminded everyone about the Boater Safety course on March 16th . Please register with the office, if interested. Our goal is to increase safety on the water.

Long Range Planning Committee (Terry Borgman/Pat Raleigh): 1. The Long Range Planning committee and General Manager are in the process of reviewing potential projects for the coming 5 years. These projects are tentatively placed in the 5-year plan and are not approved until the Board approves an annual budget in January of the upcoming year. The 5-year plan will be presented to the WPOA Board by April 1st in the LRPC Annual Report. 2. Many WPOA members would like to contribute suggestions to improve the community. The LRPC presented to the Board a draft of a suggestion form and a process to handle community suggestions and provide feed back to the submitter from the Board. The Board will decide how to initiate this process soon. The Board and the LRPC are in the process of finalizing a project submission form to capture community ideas. President Ellis asked Terry to present a draft of the form. This will formalize the process and provide feedback to the submitter. The form will be published on the Lake Waynoka website so members can print it out. There will be directions on the back of the form detailing information to be provided.

Rules and Regulations (John Buskey/Pat Raleigh): The committee has completed a revision of the election manual. The draft will be emailed to the WPOA Board to review and discuss at the next monthly workshop.

Campground Committee (Carrie Paul/Sue Eads): The campground playground has been completed. Maintenance will be doing ground restoration around the area.

- Ken Wagner asked for a pickleball court lighting installation timeline. The club would like to see it installed this spring.
 President Ellis said the Board is in the process of prioritizing projects. Our first order of business will be addressing the current Lodge issues.
- Jim Engle asked for an update about removing abandoned boats. He is willing to help in any way he can. Mgr. Cahall said a Code Enforcement Officer is currently being trained. Violations of the CODE will be identified and letters sent to homeowners.
- Doris Kitchen Thank you to the campers for approving the playground installation and previous projects, such as, the basketball and sand volleyball courts for all members to enjoy. She is concerned about 800 lots in arrears and no income being collected for those properties. She would like to see the Board address Airbnb rentals and prohibit them in the community. Treasurer Barton said that every lot in arrears is being looked at and the process to go to auctiontakes a long time. The goal of the WPOA is to acquire these lots at auction and resell them.

Adjournment: The motion to adjourn was made by Eads and seconded by Taylor. A yea/nay vote was taken. All were in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 10:37am.

WRWSD Board of Trustees Saturday Meeting – 3/9/2024

President P. Levermore called the meeting to order at 9:30 am.

President's Report (P. Levermore):

- We had a Special Executive Session meeting of the WRWSD Board on March 1st at 3pm to discuss a contract/personnel issue. The minutes of this meeting will be read into the minutes at the April 13th meeting and published in the newsletter thereafter.
- Our existing Class III Operator on the water side is retiring at the end of March. The contractor is unable to find another Class III Operator. The WRWSD Board of Trustees have been searching and advertising for the position, as well as, researching other options. We have found a Class III Operator for a bit more than we had anticipated, which will likely result in an increase to rates in the near future. The hiring process is underway to get this Class III person on board. We believe we have made the best decision for the community and WRWSD, as all other options would result in increases to rates as well.
- President P. Levermore made the first official announcement for an open position on the WRWSD Board. If you are interested in serving, please pick up an application at the office.

Treasurer's Report (S. Levermore): We welcome Vickie Feil as Assistant Treasurer to the WRWSD.

Manager and Plant Superintendent Report (Paul Cahall/Dan Pike):

- The lake valve will be opening April 1st to drain the lagoon. It will be open for 2-3 weeks with minimal water release to meet our 10:1 water ratio.
- We are in the final negotiations with the Class III Operator. We hope to wrap up the contract this week.
- President P. Levermore thanked Mgr. Cahall for his many hours and hard work searching for a Class III Operator.

Motions and Resolutions: A motion was made by Moore and seconded by Kost to approve the February 29th financial statement as distributed. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

WRWSD Board of Trustees Monday Meeting - 2/26/2024

President P. Levermore called the meeting to order at 6:00pm.

Roll Call: Present: Armstrong, Buskey, Kost, P. Levermore, S. Levermore, Moore, Mgr. Cahall, Supt. Pike

Absent: Wales was excused Others present: Vickie Feil

Minutes: A motion was made by Moore and seconded by Buskey to approve the 2/10/24 Monthly Meeting minutes as distributed. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

President's Report (P. Levermore):

- President P. Levermore introduced Vickie Feil. She was invited to the meeting to determine if she'd be interested in becoming a Trustee.
- President P. Levermore stated that all WRWSD meetings are open to the public except executive sessions.
- Trustee Buskey presented Motion #2024-06 and explained the rationale behind the proposed bylaw change. This motion will allow the WRWSD Board to announce vacancies prior to a Trustee's term ending and/or a Trustee resigning so we can maintain a full Board. Secretary Wales and Attorney Tom Mayes helped with the motion language. Please see Motions & Resolutions below.
- Our Class III Operator is retiring at the end of March. We will be in Executive Session at the end of the meeting to discuss specifics of the open position and/or switching to Brown County water in the interim. The Board is committed to exploring all options available to us.

Treasurer's Report (S. Levermore): First State Bank matched the 11 month @ 4.75% interest rate offer that we received from another bank so we will be rolling over maturing CDs to those new accounts.

Manager and Plant Superintendent Report (Paul Cahall):

- Spring Lagoon Plan The valve is closed and we plan to open it in April to drain the lagoon with minimal water release.
- Sewer Expansion We continue to gather information about loans. The Ohio Water Development Authority appears to have a program that would allow us to rollover our current bonds into the loan. Mgr. Cahall and Trustee Buskey will be participating in a phone conference to discuss options in more detail.
- Search for new water Operator-Mgr. Cahall will be posting an ad for a Class III Operator local & statewide paperswebsites.
- Supt. Pike presented two quotes to finish installing sewer lines on Blackhawk and Stallion. They were supposed to be completed when the sewer plant was created. It is unknown why it was missed. See Motions & Resolutions below.
- Supt. Pike reviewed the water loss report. We had one major leak which was repaired and we are chasing several smaller leaks. We will likely find them once the ground is drier.
- Supt. Pike reported that there continues to be a large influx of water into the sewer drains during storms. The Ohio Revised Code and WRWSD Bylaws prohibit sump pump drainage into sewer lines. There is a new device that will help Supt. Pike determine which homes are in violation. Notices will be sent out and owners will have 30 days to correct the issue.

Old Business: None New Business: None

Motions and Resolutions:

- Motion # 2024-05 was made by S. Levermore and seconded by Buskey to appoint Vickie Feil as Assistant Treasurer to the WRWSD. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- Motion #2024-06 was made by Buskey and seconded by Kost to amend the PROCEDURAL RULES & REGULATIONS OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE WAYNOKA REGIONAL WATER & SEWER DISTRICT by replacing "Section 2.5: Vacancies" with the following language: Section 2.5: Vacancies
 - 1. Any vacancy arising within the Board of Trustees, or due to an increase in the number of trustees, shall be filled by a two -thirds (2/3) majority vote of the Board of Trustees.
 - 2. The appointment of a trustee to fill a vacancy shall be for the remainder of the term of the vacated position.
 - 3. Before appointing a member to fill a vacancy on the Board, notice of the vacancy shall be announced at two regularly scheduled Saturday meetings of the Board. (Resolution 1996-02)
 - 4. Notice may be given at two regularly scheduled Saturday meetings of the Board prior to the vacancy occurring. Amendment to take effect upon passage by the Board.

A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

• Motion # 2024-07 was made by Moore and seconded by Armstrong to approve entering into a contract with Lloyd's Excavating LLC to finish installing sewer lines on Blackhawk and Stallion. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

Board Member Concerns: Trustee Buskey asked about the Audit report. We received two demerits. One was a discrepancy of the water purchased from Brown County Rural Water and the other was two items left on the long-term depreciation assets list that should have been removed.

Executive Session:

- At 6:56pm, a motion was made by Kost and seconded by Armstrong to enter into Executive Session to discuss a personnel issue and the Class III contract. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- At 7:52pm, a motion was made by Kost and seconded by Armstrong to exit the Executive Session. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

Adjournment: A motion was made by Moore and seconded by Kost to adjourn the meeting. A yea/nay vote was taken. All were in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 7:55pm.



Earth Day is also about celebrating and protecting our waterways. Preserving the health of our lake is a benefit to all property owners and makes Lake Waynoka an incredible place to live. The Lake Advisory Committee and Waynoka WaterSports Club are offering some environmentally friendly suggestions on how to make every day Earth Day at Lake Waynoka.

- > Use of silt fence with any excavation. This will reduce erosion into the lake and help with dredging
- > Shoreline protection-all rock is not the same. 6"rip rap should be the minumum as it won't get washed away
- Secure trash containers on dock and near lake
- No blowing or raking of leaves or grass in lake
- > Eco friendly boat fluids and boat wash (biodegradable, non-toxic)
- Dewinterize your boat on land not in water
- > Avoid overspray when staining/painting docks
- Rock ditches and drain pipes
- > Avoid moving any rock on dam
- Clean up area at public docks and remove all trash when you leave the area
- Recycle motor oils
- > Be mindful of lawn fertilizers and weed killers as all runoff goes in the lake


Lake Waynoka widowed group
