WPOA Board of Trustees Saturday Meeting – 4/13/2024

**Any updates from the Friday email are indicated in *italics* of the summary of each report.

**The deadline for submission of information for the monthly newsletter and other media releases is the Tuesday following the WPOA meeting at 4pm. The Office staff appreciates the cooperation of all of the clubs to share the events and activities held at Lake Waynoka.

President Ellis called the meeting to order at 10:02 am.

President Ellis led the attendees in the Lord's Prayer followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call: Present: Bynum, Crank, Eads, Ellis, Marck, Moore, Raleigh, Taylor, Mgr. Cahall

Absent: Barton was excused.

Minutes: Crank made a motion and Taylor seconded to approve the 3/9/24 WPOA Monthly minutes as printed in the newsletter. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

President's Report (Ellis): This is my last monthly meeting. Thank you to the community for the privilege and honor of serving as WPOA President. I extend a special thank you to the Lake Manager, office staff, maintenance and all employees for doing a wonderful job.

Treasurer's Report (Barton):

Operating funds

- March total operating income was \$850,000.
- March total operating expenses were \$209,000.00 with no unexpected expenses.
- Operating fund balance at the end of March was \$1,323,892.48.
- Operating income for the year at the end of March was \$504,000.00. That is 46% of the plan for 2024. Expected income at the end of March was 49% so 3% under budget.
- Operating expense for the year at the end of March was \$631,000.00. That is 21% of the plan for 2024. Expected expense at the end of March was 21% so right on budget.

Allocated Assessment Funds

- Income for allocated operating assessments in March was \$413,000.00.
- Assessment account expenditures in March totaled \$49,000.00 for the playground at the campground and new equipment at the recreation center.
- Balance of all allocated assessment accounts at the end of March was \$1,320,012.33.

Invested Funds

Invested Reserves at the end of March totaled \$525,742.75.
 Total cash on hand at the end of March was \$3,169,647.56.

Manager's Report (Paul Cahall):

- The new playground in the campground has been completed. It was installed during a really rainy period so we still have some landscaping to do around it but it looks great. I have seen lots of kids back there taking advantage of this wonderful addition. Please keep in mind this is designed for kids 2 to 12. I would also like to welcome back our campers and looking forward to another wonderful camping season.
- Lake Royal from North Carolina came for a visit April 4th and 5th to take a look at our operation and get ideas for their association. Myself, several of the staff, board members and committee volunteers spent hours with them discussing operations and finance. I have attached the letter of thanks that we received from their board of directors below.
- The spring OLCA meeting will be held at Cinnamon Lake on May 8th and 9th. These are great opportunities for lake managers and board members to get together and share information and ideas on shared issues to make all of member lakes better.
- The main valve on the lake was opened the first week in April for the spring draining of the lagoon. We expect to close that valve sometime between the 15th and the 19th of April. Due to the rain we have had, it doesn't appear the lake will drop much at all this year.
- Lodge foundation and plumbing inspections are underway and we are awaiting results of those inspections. The preliminary report on the plumbing is better than expected. Most of the issues are in areas that should not require digging up the floor of the lodge to repair.
- Keep an eye on the calendar in the newsletter, website and Facebook pages for all the fun events planned for this season from our events coordinator and our great clubs and volunteers.
- We were able to reinforce some of the Pontiac docks which resulted in half of them being saved until the Board decides what to do in the future.

Election Inspectors/Nominating (Margi Borgman/Nan McHugh/Dawn McNees, Nominating Chairperson): A motion was made to approve and adopt amendments to the election procedure manual. The changes will be posted on the website soon. Thank you to the Rules & Regulation committee for their hard work. See Motions & Resolutions below.

Lake Advisory (T. Redick/Jim Marck): We had 27 people in attendance for the certified boater safety course. Beginning April 1st, 2025, anyone registering a boat must show proof of boater safety certification before a permit will be issued.

Long Range Planning Committee (Terry Borgman/Pat Raleigh): The LRPC is tasked to submit a yearly planning strategy report which includes capital projects, budget strategy, ect. The Board made a motion to approve the report. See Motions & Resolutions below. This is not a motion to approve any of the projects listed.

Rules and Regulations (John Buskey/Pat Raleigh): None

Campground Committee (Carrie Paul/Sue Eads): Thank you to Paul, Marty and maintenance for prepping the area for the new playground. Thank you to the Civic Club for donating \$10,000 and WPOA for donating \$5,000 to the purchase of the playground equipment. The playground is for 2-12 year olds and is open to all residents. The basketball and volleyball courts were put in with campground funds but are open to all residents. We could use a few more benches at the recreational areas and are accepting donations. We will be sending a survey to campers asking for feedback on projects they would like to do. There are several campsites open. The campers would like to see a financial report for campground income and expenses. Mgr. Cahall said the information is available at the office for anyone interested.

Unfinished Business: President Ellis prepared the following statement. I have received some inquiries from the membership as to whether any action is going to be taken by the Board to prohibit wake boats or wake surfing at Lake Waynoka. In response to those inquiries, I have written the following statement. During the past several months, the Board has received feedback from the WPOA membership concerning their views on wake boats at Lake Waynoka. Some members have said that they greatly enjoy their wake boats and have significant financial investment in their properties and wake boats at Lake Waynoka. Other members have responded that they are greatly concerned that the large waves produced by wake boats are causing increased shoreline erosion, harm to the lake habitat, and accelerated damage to their docks. These members have argued that Lake Waynoka is too narrow, too shallow, and too small to accommodate wake boats. Other members have stated that they feel unsafe due to the large artificial waves caused by wake boats. Also, others have described their boats being swamped by wake boats, this issue has caused a division within the Board concerning what actions to take. I believe the Board of Trustees has a fiduciary responsibility to represent the entire community. I also believe that the safety of the community, as well as the preservation of the lake should be top priorities for the Board going forward.

Although I hold absolutely no animosity towards wake boat owners, I believe that wake boats are unsuitable and unsafe for our smaller lake. I would urge the incoming Board and President to explore and consider all options available to safeguard our community. I urge them to find and then take the right course of action that is necessary to protect our community and preserve our lake. This course of action must ensure the well-being of Lake Waynoka into the future.

• Motion #377 (see below) discussion before the roll call vote. President Ellis said the motion was based on benchmarks from other communities. We are the only lake community without any restrictions. We have 900 boat registrations and this is a preventative measure for safety. Trustee Eads said that information was collected from boat companies, the State of Ohio and the Ohio Lake Community Association which helped form the proposed motion. 95% of boats purchased are 24' and under. She believes the restrictions will help with wake issues. Secretary Crank stated that any boats exceeding these limitations will be grandfathered until said boat is no longer registered.

New Business: None

Motions & Resolutions: A motion was made by Taylor and seconded by Eads to approve the LRPC report. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

- Motion #376 was made by Crank and seconded by Eads to approve and adopt the attached amended WPOA General Rules and Regulations, Volume 3, Election Procedure Manual, dated April 13, 2024. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- Motion #377 was made by Raleigh and seconded by Moore to adopt the following regulation: Watercraft Size and Outboard Motor Limitations (All length restrictions are non-inclusive of an installed inboard/outboard motor) (Applicable to any watercraft registered at Lake Waynoka after May 1, 2024.) Pontoon boats and other watercraft relying on floats, tubes, or pontoons to remain buoyant shall be no longer than 26 feet in length or have a beam of more than 8.5 feet.
 •Sailboats and other watercraft propelled wholly or partially by sail shall be no longer than 26 feet in length or have a beam of more than 8.5 feet.
 •Sailboats and other watercraft propelled wholly or partially by sail shall be no longer than 26 feet in length or have a beam of more than 8.5 feet.
 •All other watercraft not defined as a sailboat or pontoon boat shall be no longer than 24 feet in length or have a beam of more than 8.5 feet.
 •All other watercraft propelled by outboard marine engines are limited to one primary outboard engine and one auxiliary outboard engine with a maximum horsepower of 25HP. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed with 5 yeas (Barton by proxy vote) and 4 nays (Taylor, Crank, Raleigh and Marck).

- Shawnee Women's The rubber duck/ice cream social will be held on May 24th at 6pm poolside. This event is for members only and you will need your green card to be admitted. We will be selling ducks at various events for \$5/each.
 Prizes will be awarded for 1st , 2nd and 3rd place. Rain date is May 25th.

Board Comments and Concerns: None

Membership Compliments and Concerns:

- Jim Engle appreciated Paul's feedback about abandoned boats and asked him to elaborate. Mgr. Cahall said the Code Enforcement Officer has been working hard and 14 violation letters have been sent out. Beginning May 1st, all boats must have a current registration sticker. Our concerted effort is to remove 4-5 abandoned boats a year. We will be offering violators free disposal if they sign the title over to the WPOA.
- Jeff Schubert and his family moved here a little over a year ago. He thanked the community for being so welcoming. Thank you to the Board for donating their time and service to WPOA and hopes that people are doing it for the right reason. He enjoyed reciting the Lord's Prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance at the meeting. Lake Waynoka is a beautiful place to live.
- Ken Crank This is my last monthly meeting. Thank you for the opportunity to serve such a great community.

Adjournment: The motion to adjourn was made by Taylor and seconded by Moore. A yea/nay vote was taken. All were in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 10:31am.

President's Report (P. Levermore): I am making the official second announcement for a vacancy on the WRWSD Board. This is to replace Buskey. Manager and Plant Superintendent Report (Paul Cahall/Dan Pike):

- We continue to track leaks and have found one near the water plant.

WRWSD Board of Trustees Monday Meeting – 3/25/2024

President P. Levermore called the meeting to order at 6:00pm.

Roll Call: Present: Armstrong, Buskey, Kost, P. Levermore, S. Levermore, Moore, Wales, Mgr. Cahall, Supt. Pike Others present: Vickie Feil

Minutes:

- A motion was made by Moore and seconded by Kost to approve the 3/1/24 Special Meeting minutes as distributed. A yea/ nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- A motion was made by Buskey and seconded by S. Levermore to approve the 3/9/24 monthly meeting minutes as distributed. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

President's Report (P. Levermore):

- Just a reminder that the annual WRWSD meeting will be April 20th at 7pm in the Rec Center. Vice President Moore will be unable to attend due to prior commitments.
- I will make a second announcement of the vacant WRWSD Trustee position at the April 13th monthly meeting. Any interested candidates should submit an application at the office.

Treasurer's Report (S. Levermore): None

Manager and Plant Superintendent Report (Paul Cahall):

- Greg Wilson was hired as the new WRWSD Superintendent. He will begin April 1st. Greg will be instrumental in planning the sewer expansion and brings valuable experience to our crew. Currently, Dan Pike is working on continuing his education and is looking forward to learning from Greg.
- Our water loss is up to 35% which is very high indicating a number of significant leaks. We like to keep that number to 15% or less. The WRWSD crew has fixed 4 leaks and just found 2 more. We will have to wait until the wet weather clears to find the other leaks. Further action may need to be taken if we are unable to locate the leaks within the next few months.
- The WRWSD had to dig up a section of a homeowner's driveway to repair a leak. The homeowners would like to repave their entire driveway. They received an estimate and presented it to management. The Board agreed to pay for blacktopping a 7' x 11' area over the hole created but the rest of the cost would be the homeowner's responsibility. The Board also agreed to pay for repair of the Frontier line that was cut during the process.
- The lake valve will be opening next week to drain the lagoon.
- The Board is in the process of exploring the sewer expansion financing options. Trustee Buskey wrote a memorandum for future Board members and WRWSD employees. Currently, we have a bond issued from 1995 that funded the initial sewer plant start-up. Lot owners in Phase 1 (lots around Waynoka Drive) pay \$62.90/year to repay the bond; all sewer users also pay a small fee per month to contribute to the bond repayment. There are no penalties for paying the bonds off early, however, we may be able to roll the unpaid balance into the new loan for the sewer expansion. The Board is going to us reserves to pay CT Consultants for the new plant designs. We are gathering financing options from Ohio Development now and will gather the EPA financing options in August. Unfortunately, Lake Waynoka does not qualify for USDA grants due to the high median income of all residents.

Old Business: Vice president Moore asked for an update on pending projects. Supt. Pike stated that the painting of the water tower and the finishing of the sewer lines are scheduled to begin when the weather breaks.

New Business:

- Trustee Armstrong asked the Board to review the water and sewer reserves and set a baseline amount to keep on hand in the event of an emergency. She is concerned about depleting the reserves on projects and not replacing the funds. Right now, the sewer reserve is considerably higher because we have been saving for the sewer plant expansion. The Board will discuss minimum reserve amounts in the near future.
- Secretary Wales would like to see another WRWSD plant tour for the community since it was well received last year. A fall tour would be most likely so Greg Wilson will have a chance to get settled into his new position. More information to come.

Motions and Resolutions: None

Board Member Concerns: Trustee Buskey said it has been a pleasure serving on the WRWSD Board for the past 20+ years. He will be around the next few months to answer any questions the Board may have about the WRWSD plant and operations. Supt. Pike asked Buskey to look for any old water plant diagrams. Everyone wished him well and are sad to see him retire. **Adjournment:** A motion was made by Kost and seconded by Wales to adjourn the meeting. A yea/nay vote was taken. All were in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 7:23pm.

Down Memory Lane Betty Purdin (Historian)

In early 1970 American Realty, a firm from Memphis Tenn; came to Brown County Ohio to build two resort communities. With the first being Lake Lorelei in Fayetteville, Ohio. The other was our very own Lake Waynoka in Sardinia, Ohio. Lake Lorelei was started and completed before Lake Waynoka. Lake Waynoka property was purchased by American Realty that was farm land in the amount of 3662 acres. Lake Waynoka would be divided in some 4000 lots. People could build homes or just for own a lot for use of all the facilities the lake has to offer. Lake Waynoka has a 310 acre lake that is used for boating and fishing, also there is a lodge, swimming pool and a camping area. American Realty filed for bankruptcy and Lake Waynoka would be one of the 17 lakes listed in the filing. Lake Waynoka utilities inc. was also included. The actual filing took place September 5th 1975. At that time there was a small amount of homes that had been built. Several members formed a board of trustees in order to protect their investment. They formed the property owners assoc. to negotiate with American Realty. In November of 1975 property owners were able to reach an agreement that put Waynoka back in the hands of the 3000 some owners. Lake Waynoka is looking to the future with a lodge, fitness center, four pools, tennis courts, a large camping area and 50 miles of blacktopped roads. Lake Waynoka has its own water and sewage company (WRWSD) with all licensed state operators. All of this has been completed by members hard work and devotion. The lake now has an approx. 1000 homeowners and has celebrated over 50 years!

The Lake Waynoka Garden Club is holding a meeting Thursday, May 9th, at 6:30 p.m. at the Lodge.

Our special guests will be a representatives from the Adams-Brown Sportsman Club Chapter of Quail Forever. Quail Forever's mission is to conserve quail, pheasants, & other wildlife through habitat improvements, public access, education, and conservation advocacy.

This meeting will be open to the public under an open pass. The garden club welcomes Jeff Ratliff, president of the Adams-Brown Sportsman Club Chapter.

He will be joined by Susan Ratliff, secretary, Mike Ranly, VP, & Barb Bauer, habitat chair.

They will be speaking to residents of Lake Waynoka and surrounding farmers about their program to create pollinator plots & bluebird trails. Their organization provides the seeds, bluebird houses, the equipment & manpower necessary to create a habitat for pollinators & bluebirds. The field preparation at the lake would take place in the fall. Tilling and planting will be in the spring of 2025. Lake residents with vacant lots have already stepped up to offer their lots for planting. The Garden Club already maintains a small pollinator garden at Little Turtle Recreation Area & many local gardeners raise Monarch caterpillars & butterflies at the lake. The bluebird trail can be created this spring on utility poles & other poles following the guidelines of house spacing, height & nearby habitat.

It is evident that our Bob White quail population has dwindled over the years. They would also like to invite local farmers that surround the lake to speak to them about how to create a habitat to attract Bob White quail.

If we are successful, the familiar sound of the 'Bob White' quail will once again be a part of our beautiful community.






