WPOA Board of Trustees Saturday Meeting - 06/14/2025

**Any updates from the Friday email are indicated in italics of the summary of each report.

**The deadline for submission of information for the monthly newsletter and other media releases is the Tuesday following the WPOA meeting at 4pm. The Office staff appreciates the cooperation of all of the clubs to share the events and activities held at Lake Waynoka.

President Eads called the meeting to order at 10:10am and led the attendees in the Lord's Prayer followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call: Present: Barton, Bisbee, Eads, Klein, Lane, Miller, Wagner, Mgr. Wilkin

Absent: Moore and Bynum were excused.

Minutes: Barton made a motion and Lane seconded to approve the 5/10/25 WPOA Monthly minutes as printed in the newsletter. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

President's Report (Eads): Thank you for attending. I welcome comments and suggestions at eads@lakewaynoka.com . I would like to see all of us work together for the betterment of our community. While everyone's vote counts, the majority rules. We will continue to follow Robert's Rules of Order.

Treasurer's Report (Lane):

Operating Funds

- May total operating income was \$259,541.32.
- May total operating expenses were \$270,553.40 with no unexpected expenses.
- Operating fund balance at the end of May was \$1,291,356.17.
- Operating income for the year at the end of May was \$2,090,059.07. That is 63% of the plan for 2025. Expected income at the end of May was 65% so 2% under budget.
- Operating expense for the year at the end of May was \$1,213,570.44. That is 37% of the plan for 2025. Expected expense at the end of May was 38% so 1% under budget.

Allocated Assessment Funds

- Income for allocated operating assessments in May was \$29,560.50.
- Assessment account expenditures in May totaled \$24,337.55. This includes \$19,250.00 for Aqua Doc services.
- Balance of all allocated assessment accounts at the end of May was \$1,146, 376.40.

Invested Funds

- Invested Reserves at the end of May totaled \$540,837.85.
- Total cash on hand at the end of May was \$2,937,724.79.

Our annual audit report was submitted and there were no notable exceptions. Our tax returns were completed and sent out. Manager's Report (Mgr. Wilkin):

- First and foremost, I want to sincerely thank the 70 members who took time out of their week to attend our recent General Manager's meeting. It was a fantastic turnout, and I genuinely appreciate the opportunity to meet with you, hear your concerns, and share ideas. Your questions and conversations—ranging from the Lounge and the Marina to Aqua Doc and beyond—are what help us grow and improve as a community. Thank you for engaging in such constructive and respectful dialogue.
- I'd like to announce our Employee and Member of the month. The employee of the month is Mrs. Kay Bundy. Kay has been employed by Lake Waynoka as a full-time employee for over 36 years. Kay started working at the restaurant in 1973. She came back to work for the lake in 1989 in maintenance, worked in WRWSD for 31 years and has been the Office Manager since 2023. She was nominated be her peers and voted as the Employee of the Month. Congratulations! The Member of the Month is Ms. Betty Purdin. Betty has lived here at the Lake since the beginning. I heard it said that "Betty is the bomb", and "If you don't know Betty, you don't know lake Waynoka." Betty has been involved in many great efforts throughout the years including arranging events and dances for the youth of the lake, fireworks at the lake, and I think she is a member of every club here at the lake. She has served on the board for approximately 20 years with many of those years as President of the Board. Let's all recognize Betty as the Member of the Month.

- Pool Issues: We encountered a few challenges with the pool early in the season, but our team worked hard to address them as quickly and efficiently as possible. I feel we have kept the community up to date on the issues surrounding the pool through our Facebook page. Thank you to all residents for your patience during those initial hiccups.
- Lounge Update: I want to thank our new management team that has been operating the Lounge since May 18th. If you have visited the Lounge, hopefully you have had a chance to meet Mr. Mark Clyburn, who is now operating the lounge. Through Mr. Clyburn's efforts, the Lounge continues to see updates, including improved activities and enhanced cleanliness standards to make it a more welcoming space for all. Stay tuned as they roll out more improvements in the coming weeks.
- Marina Update: The Marina is open and active. If you need fuel for your boat, the Marina is still operating the pumps. If you need a snack or refreshing beverage, you can get that at the Marina as well.
- Marina Pointe: I want to thank Mr. Ron Garland for all of his efforts at Marina Pointe. I declared him Mayor of the
 Pointe due to his dedication and efforts to ensure there are activities and that the area looks great. Without his help,
 the Pointe would look much different.
- Rubber Duck Regatta, Music on the Green & Memorial Day weekend: The Rubber Duck Regatta was a splash hit. Thank you to everyone who participated and supported the fun. The Shawnee Women's Club knows how to have fun! Our first Music on the Green was a great success, with families, friends and neighbors enjoying the good weather and great tunes. Music and a food truck at the Campground was enjoyed by many. Memorial Day weekend was very busy-and most importantly, safe. We thank our community for coming together to honor the brave men and women who made the ultimate sacrifice.
- Boat Patrol & Lake Safety: Our boat patrol is now active and out on the water. Their presence is a reminder to all of us to stay vigilant and practice good boating safety. We're still seeing some issues related to boat certifications, and we urge everyone to double-check that your vessel is registered and compliant with lake policies. Safety is not optional-it's essential. We're also emphasizing general safety around the lake-from watercraft etiquette to observing wake zones and protecting swimmers. Please take all the rules seriously for the well-being of all.
- Insurance Rates: We wanted to share the great news that the Lake's general insurance has been renewed for another year. We were able to achieve savings on the insurance premiums of over 13% (approximately \$20,000), and we are hopeful that we can change the renewal cycle to every 3 years instead of annually, beginning next year.
- In Case of Emergency: Whether it's a suspicious activity or a medical concern, please remember to call 911 or the non-emergency number at 937-378-4155. I personally witnessed how quickly our local response teams act when called. It makes a difference, and your call could save a life or prevent an incident. Many individuals call the front gate expecting that they are contacting dispatch-but they are not. If there is a need that requires an police officer, please call the appropriate numbers. The front gate is not a dispatch center. Also, please do not call the Sheriff's Office directly, as the dispatch center is located in a separate building, which can further delay response times.
- Aqua Doc has started treating the lake for Algae. They will be treating the Lake once per week and the Water reservoir
 every other week. We also released 200 carp to help mitigate the algae growth. We will keep an eye on the algae and
 follow the lead of Aqua Doc if something needs to change.

Election Inspectors/Nominating (Nan McHugh, L. Stover; Dawn McNees, Nominating Chairperson): None Lake Advisory (TBD/Bisbe): None

Long Range Planning Committee (Borgman/TBD): Terry reported that dredging begins soon. The LRPC presented a schedule to the Board. It includes the beginning of the second cycle to address all cove channels on a rotating basis beginning at Quachita. We have 3 barges and 1 excavator.

Rules and Regulations (Taylor/Barton): Vice President Barton reported that the R&R committee has met and began work on short term lease/rental language in the CODE.

Campground Committee (Abbatiello/Klein): Jerry brought forth camper complaints about blacktop grindings placed around the pavilion and in low lying areas. Mgr. Wilkin said this is a temporary fix to control water pooling. President Eads said the grindings pack down nicely and will form a nice base for resurfacing at a later date. This saves us money especially when compared to paying for all the pavement grindings to be removed from the Waynoka Drive project.

Community Suggestions (Klein): Trustee Klein reported that several suggestions have been received. She apologized for the delay in communication as Treasurer Lane and AJ are beginning work to digitalize the process but paper forms will still be available for those members wishing to use them. Suggestions received include: Lake Waynoka (LW) reference book located in the library; assessment of LW perimeters by volunteers; news/notices added to the LW website; fans, sanitizer and ½ sized weights in the fitness room; signs at the beach area stating no fishing allowed; dedicated visitor/member parking area at the beach.

Unfinished Business: The Board moved to Executive Session for this portion of the meeting.

- At 10:43am, Lane motioned and Barton seconded to enter into executive session to discuss a legal matter. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- At 11:04am, Lane motioned and Barton seconded to exit executive session. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

New Business: Motion #391 was presented. See below. The Board noted prior to a vote, that a contingency plan is in place for Marina operations.

Motions & Resolutions: Motion #391 was made by Lane and seconded by Barton. Be it hereby moved that the Board of Trustees of the Waynoka Property Owners Association, Inc., formally approves and directs Board President Sue Eads to issue and sign a final written letter on behalf of the Board to Mr. Mike Napier regarding his evection from the Lake Waynoka Marina property. The letter shall outline the Board's final position, reference the prior lease terms, document lease expiration and violations, and reinforce the requirement for Mr. Napier to comply with the terms of the eviction notice, including removal of property and settlement of any outstanding obligations. This letter shall serve as the Board's official and final communication on the matter and shall be entered into the Association's records accordingly. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously. Trustee Bynum and Secretary Moore voted to approve the motion by proxy votes.

Community Organizations:

- Civic Club Dave Adler: Our next meeting is June 23rd. Please consider joining. Bingo tonight. Dave introduced Tony Sousa to give an update on the Veteran Flag project. Tony thanked the Civic Club, Shawnee Women's Club and the WaterSports Club for their generous donations to the project. Thank you to Mgr. Wilkin and the administration staff for handling applications for banners. Thank you to Terry Borgman, Tom Kizer and Michael LaPlante for volunteering their time to help with the flag project. Tony has a few of the banners on display today. We have received 10 and will be placing an order for another 10 soon. We continue to meet with Duke Energy for telephone pole certifications that will allow us to place the military flags.
- WaterSports Matt K.: Our next meeting is Saturday, June 21st at 10am. Ken Light and Nan Wales have generously offered to host the meeting at their home on 11Mohican East Cove. We will be sponsoring a Mardi Gras themed golf cart parade on June 28th.
- Shawnee Women Nan McHugh: Thank you to all of the Rubber Duck regatta and Ice Cream Social volunteers. We will have 2 booths at Waynoka days. One is the basket raffle and the other will be a food booth. We currently have 30 members but are always looking for more women to join our group.

Board Comments and Concerns: None

Adjournment: The motion to adjourn was made by Lane and seconded by Klein. A yea/nay vote was taken. All were in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 11:17am.

WRWSD Board of Trustees Saturday Meeting – 06/14/2025

President Levermore called the meeting to order at 9:30am.

Roll Call: Present: Armstrong, Harper, Levermore, Kost, Wales, Mgr. Wilkin

Absent: Feil and Moore was excused.

Minutes: A motion was made by Harper and seconded by Wales to approve the 5/27/25 minutes as distributed and read. A yea/ nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

President's Report (Levermore):

- President Levermore made the first official announcement of a Trustee vacancy beginning in July. Interested candidates should fill out an application for consideration. They are available at the Office.
- President Levermore read a statement from the WRWSD Board.
 - The WRWSD Board is charged with the responsibility of maintaining and managing the water and sewer infrastructure for the Lake Waynoka community. For several years, we have expressed concerns regarding the long -term capacity and sustainability of these systems. Currently, we are working closely with our Engineer of Record, DLZ, to assess and plan for future needs. One significant consideration is the use of grinder pumps. These systems represent a substantial investment, not just in initial installation, but in the long-term maintenance they requireresponsibilities that fall to the WRWSD. When a grinder pump fails or needs replacement, the cost is borne by the sewer district. This stand in contrast to a mound septic system, which is the standard for properties located outside of the Lake Waynoka community. These systems typically cost between \$40,000 and \$50,000 and when they fail, the full burden of repair or replacement falls to the homeowner. The recent increase in water and sewer tap fees- and ultimately the cost of associated with grinder pumps-does not impact current homeowners. These adjustments are directed at future development within Lake Waynoka. They are necessary to ensure that our community's infrastructure can continue to meet demand while preserving environmental standards and operational reliability. As a community, we are responsible for the proper treatment and disposal of wastewaternot just today, but well into the future. These updates are a necessary step towards ensuring that our sewer systems remain functional, safe and compliant for all residents of Lake Waynoka. We appreciate your understanding and continued support as we plan for the long-term well-being of our community.

Treasurer's Report (Feil): None

Manager and Plant Superintendent Report (Mgr. Wilkin/Supt. Wilson):

- We had a group of students from ESC tour the WRWSD plant and learn about careers in water and sewer treatment.
- The GAC filter contains charcoal which filters our water to improve taste and reduce odor. Our surface water contains manganese and this is a side note of the filtration but it reduces the lifespan of the charcoal. Our WRWSD plant was constructed in the 1970s and we have been continually upgrading equipment and improving the plant required by the EPA. That is why costs keep rising.
- Mgr. Wilkin and Supt. Wilson met with Brown County Rural Water authorities to see if there may be an opportunity to
 have them provide our water in the future. They stated that they have too many commitments/contracts with other
 municipalities to consider this request. Currently, BCRW provides water to us on an as-needed basis but that can be
 revoked at any time. President Levermore stated that we cannot depend on sustained use of BCRW and we are
 researching options.
- Trustee Armstrong asked Mgr. Wilkin to emphasize the higher water, sewer and grinder rates. Mgr. Wilkin explained
 that this only effects new home builds. This is one-time purchase that includes a lifetime commitment by the WRWSD. A
 homeowner building outside the lake, would be responsible for all costs to repair their septic system. We are trying to
 offset future costs and be in-line with other homes in the area.

Old Business: None

New Business: Motion #2025-18 (below) discussion. Mgr. Wilkin stated that the 2025 WRWSD budget was based on 20 new home builds for the year 2025. We have since surpassed this amount with 26 new homes for the year. The State Auditor requires that we balance our budget to meet expenditures so this is why you may see budget amendments throughout the year.

Motions and Resolutions:


- A motion was made by Kost and seconded by Harper to approve the May 31st financial statement as distributed. A yea/ nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.
- Motion #2025-18 was made by Wales and seconded by Armstrong to Amend 2025 Budget as follows: Expenses 9820-01
 Purchase Grinder Pumps; Budgeted amount \$125,854.00; Amended amount \$252,106.00; Difference of \$126,252.00.
 Total expense budgeted amount \$1,846,031.66 and amended amount total \$1,972,283.66. A roll call vote was taken
 and the motion passed unanimously.

Board Member Concerns: None Membership Concerns:

- Nancee Klein understands the reasoning behind the higher tap and grinder installation fees but is disappointed on how it was rolled out. No notice was given to property owners who may have been planning to build a home in the near future. The sudden passage of these increased fees have caught many by surprise. She would like to see the motion revisited and a tiered structure rollout so everyone can prepare properly.
- Dave Trainum is one of the members caught by surprise at the newly implemented increases. He bought a lot in April, secured a pre-approved loan and met with the builder. He now has to put the new home construction on hold until he figures out what to do. To add insult to injury, he found out about the increases via Facebook and is disappointed that it was not communicated properly.
- Doris Kitchen would like to see a committee formed to pursue merging with Brown County Rural Water in the future. Mgr. Wilkin reiterated that he had a meeting with BCRW within the past two weeks and it is not an option based on their current commitments to other municipalities.

Adjournment: The motion to adjourn was made by Kost and seconded by Harper. A yea/nay vote was taken. All were in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 10:06am.

WRWSD Board of Trustees Monday Meeting - 05/27/2025

President P. Levermore called the meeting to order at 6:00pm.

Roll Call: Present: Armstrong, Feil, Harper, Kost, Levermore, Wales, Mgr. Wilkin, Supt. Wilson Absent: Moore was excused.

Minutes:

A motion was made by Armstrong and seconded by Wales to approve the 5/10/25 Monthly Meeting minutes as distributed. A yea/nay vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

President's Report (Levermore):

- A WRWSD Trustee position will be opening in July. President Levermore will be making the first announcement, per WRWSD bylaws, at the meeting on June 14th. After that time, interested parties should fill out an application for consideration. The search committee has identified two members that may be interested in serving.
- President Levermore received a note from a member(s) questioning the billing of WRWSD water and sewer rates during
 the off-season when no one is using those services. The Board discussed the note and pointed to the WPOA and
 WRWSD language below.
 - ♦ Article Section 8.2. of the WRWSD Rules & Regulations states: "...vacant dwellings: b) Owner shall be responsible for the minimum monthly water/sewer charge."
 - ◆ RESTRICTIVE COVENANTS LAKE WAYNOKA SUBDIVISION, BROWN COUNTY, OHIO (at the end of the CODE online) states: SANITARY SPECIFICATIONS: Article 4: "...pursuant to ORC 6119.06(AA), each dwelling or other building containing sanitary facilities shall be connected to the sanitary sewer system operated by the Waynoka Regional Water and Sewer District (the "WRWSD"), its successors or assigns, and thereafter Grantee, his heirs, executors, or assigns shall pay a minimum sewer service fee per month regardless of use. [As amended 09-10-2022]"

• RESTRICTIVE COVENANTS LAKE WAYNOKA SUBDIVISION, BROWN COUNTY, OHIO (at the end of the CODE online) states: POTABLE WATER AVAILABILITY USAGE: Article 9: "...the District, its successors or assigns, pursuant to ORC 6119.06 (AA), upon receiving a written request and the current water tap fee will install a water service connection from the main to the Grantee's lot line, and thereafter Grantee, his heirs, executors or assigns shall pay a minimum water service fee per month, regardless of use, in lieu of and in the same manner as the water availability charge. [As amended 09-10-2022]"

Treasurer's Report (Feil): Mgr. Wilkin passed out the profit/loss statement for review. It is current as of end of day, May 27, 2025.

Manager and Plant Superintendent Report (Mgr. Wilkin/Supt. Wilson):

- Water and Sewer Taps: We are inundated with orders for tap installations. We are doing our best to keep up with demand but the weather is not cooperating some days.
- GAC Filter Media Replacement: The carbon needs to be replaced in the GAC filter. The carbon helps with taste and odor of our water and reduces PFAS chemicals (forever chemicals). Typically, the carbon lasts several years but, unfortunately, traps manganese from our surface water thus reducing the carbon's lifespan. The cost to replace the carbon is almost \$53,000. The Board will make a motion at Saturday's meeting to approve the funds from reserves and asked Supt. Wilson to schedule the project. DLZ recommended to add another system to pre-filter the water coming into the GAC filter. There is a grant available to help with the cost and we will be applying for it.
- Chemical Storage Area Planning: DLZ is creating a design to submit to the EPA. Currently, our employees empty 50-gallon drums into the tanks which is very hazardous. The chemical storage area would allow tankers to come in and pump the chemicals directly into the storage tanks which will protect our employees.
- We are still switching to BCRW on the weekend and holidays. There is not much of a cost difference when Supt. Wilson ran the numbers considering employee overtime pay.
- Supt. Wilson informed the Board that the Class I Operator pay was significantly increased in the surrounding area.
- There continues to be a direct correlation between rainfall and the amount of wastewater received in the plant pointing to sump pumps and drains being illegally dumped into our sewer system.
- Financial Signature Threshold: Mgr. Wilkin asked the Board to consider raising the amount for which he can sign a check. Currently, it is \$1,500 and anything over that amount requires a second signature from the President or Treasurer. The Board considered raising it to \$5,000 but will discuss it in more detail at the next workshop.
- Grinder Pumps: The Board discussed the cost of grinder pumps. We received an order of 21 and only a few remain for new home installations. This does not account for replacing broken and antiquated grinder pumps at current homes. In an effort to reduce shipping costs, large orders must be made and typically takes 2-3 months to receive. Unsold spec homes equals delays in receiving our money to purchase more grinder pumps. We can't keep covering the cost. The Board discussed the cost of installing a septic system outside the lake which is in the vicinity of \$50,000 and that is just for wastewater. The cost of a grinder pump, water tap and sewer tap is \$18,000 for Lake Waynoka. More discussion occurred about researching other lake communities experiencing rapid growth and what they are doing, the capacity of our current WRWSD infrastructure, exploring BCRW as a water option in the future and limiting the amount of grinders available each year among other things. In the end, the Board made a motion to increase water tap fees, sewer tap fees and grinder pump fees. See Motion #2025-17 below.

Old Business: None New Business: None

Motions and Resolutions: Motion #2025-17 was made by Armstrong and seconded by Feil to increase the water tap fee to \$10,000, increase the sewer tap fee to \$10,000 and increase the grinder pump fee to \$30,000 effective immediately, May 27, 2025. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously. **Trustee Kost left the meeting early and was not present during the motion roll call vote. **

Board Member Concerns: Secretary Wales asked to revisit WRWSD infrastructure limitations at the next workshop. Mgr. Wilkin and Supt. Wilson will be meeting with BCRW this week and DLZ is researching surface water capacity. This will give us more detailed information for discussion.

Adjournment: The motion to adjourn was made by Wales and seconded by Armstrong. A yea/nay vote was taken. All were in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 7:30pm.



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
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
